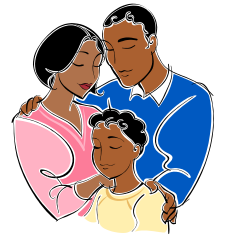

Hello Mr. And Mrs Sala, (Or whoever grades my paper!)

I had a couple of questions about this lesson, but first just wanted to thank you for the lesson.

They've been a blessing for me and I know it's a lot of work for you to check them. I pray that God blesses your ministry and will continue to do so. Here's my question. I noticed that the lesson talks about sever "laws", for example, the Law of Moses, the Moral Law, the Ten Commandments), ceremonial law, political law, etc. Then there's also Jesus' statement about the two greatest commandments, to love God and to love others. Finally, there's our conscience. Here's what I want to know: How do we know which parts of the law we need to follow in this age of grace? My conscience, the Ten Commandments, and the two most important commandments given by Jesus seems to cover pretty much all of it. Or do we need to follow everything we find in the Bible— Old and New Testament? Do you have a study on this subject? Oh, also please keep me in your prayers. We have a Christian program here and the chaplain has placed me in it. Lots of classes and activities—all of us living in a special wing we call the "God Pod"! But it's all new to me and suddenly I'm VERY BUSY!! Eek! Jim Tx
We have written Jim a letter answering his question and enjoy to see the deep thought the lessons provoke.

Dear Bro and Sis Sala,

I am taking my time on the lesson to get the full understanding of what God is saying to me. My father died from alcohol abuse cirrhosis of the liver and my mother from cancer. I was never married or had kids. My story is like that of most other substance abusers, but one difference is that I found a Higher Power to relate to who carried me out of the trap of drugs and alcohol abuse to a life of spirituality. Before I came to jail and found Christ I was living a double life. I had a nice home, family who loved me, a nice car and a good job. But I had ran the streets. I also had a street family that I accepted from Satan. I had made the streets my home, chasing girls, drugs, alcohol and all the pleasures that Satan had to offer. I was living in abandoned buildings and cars. I was sleeping on park benches, store front steps, and hopping from house to house. I was too embarrassed to go home or let any of my family see me. I still had a job and went to work but instead of coming home from work with my pay check, I would go left instead of right. They did not even know if I was alive or dead because I chose my addiction and now the addiction and the streets controlled me. It was horrible. I was ashamed, embarrassed and out of control. I had lost everything and betrayed everyone in my life. I had fear, violence, hatred, anger, depression and selfishness. I had lost respect for myself as a person. But I found a Higher Power to relate too and lift me out of the darkness of the devil to a life of righteousness and that was Jesus Christ who gave me love, joy, peace, longsuffering, goodness, self respect for myself and others and faith! He saw the best in me when no one else did. He showed me that I had so much good qualities and gifts that was buried for so long that it took Him to bring them back to the surface. Now I have my family back and respect for myself and from people who love me! I have a new family of Christians now here and on the outside. Brothers and



sisters that support me and encourage me to stay on the Path with Jesus! Now I have been in 16 different Christian plays with the team at Coal Township Prison and help win souls for the Lord. I have a trade now in carpentry and now I am a certified member of one of the nations largest construction industries for a career in building homes. Now I can walk out of here with my head held high and not look back on the past and with God working in my life I tend to focus on the sunset, sunrise, flowers trees, and the beauty of such a refreshing way of life after years of darkness. *Therefore if any man be in Christ he is a new creature, old things are passed away, behold all things are become new. 2 Cor 5:17*
