INTEGRITY OF THE HEART

There is an ad campaign that says "What's in your wallet?" But with God, it's not what's in your wallet, but what's in your heart! As a man thinks in his heart so is he (Pro 23:7). So it seems that the heart and the mind work together. It has been said that research is recognizing that the heart has it's own mini-brain! Jeremiah says that "the heart is deceitful above all things and desperately wicked: who can know it?" The Lord answers, "I the Lord search the heart, I try the reins, even to give every man according to his ways and according to the fruit of his doings."

The word 'integrity' is defined by Strong's as: oneness, uprightness, full, perfect, innocence. It examines the **motives** in our heart behind our actions and words. We like to say in class that integrity is biblical oneness: being the same on the outside as we are on the inside. Even King Abimelech in Genesis 20:4-5 used the integrity or innocence of his heart as his defense



when God accused him of taking another man's (Abraham) wife. And God accepted that he did it innocently and saved him from a greater sin! God demanded 'integrity of heart' (purity) as a condition for Solomon's continued prosperity in 1 Kings 9:4. God even brags on Job's integrity during his tests in Job 2:3& 9. In fact, Job's examination of his heart in Chapter 31 is an awesome **Step 4**, a **fearless and searching moral inventory**, as we say in recovery. Job takes a good look at his heart and his motives seeking a reason for his misfortunes, not knowing he was in a severe test instigated between God and Satan.

In a day of self-promotion and manipulation (we call it advertising oneself), it becomes vital to our walk to examine our heart and keep our motives pure before God. Psalm 7:8 says, "The Lord shall judge the people: Judge me, O Lord, according to my righteousness and according to the integrity that is in me." We can fool men with our self-righteousness, but we can't fool God! He knows the thoughts and intentions (motives) of our own hearts! James 3:14 gives us another "fearless and searching moral inventory" a heart examination: But if you have bitter envying, and strife in your hearts, glory not and lie not against the truth. For where envying and strife is, there is confusion and every evil work. But the wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle and easy to be entreated, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality and without hypocrisy. What causes fights and quarrels among you? Don't they come from your desires that battle within you? You want something (position, money, a person), but you don't get it. You kill and covet, but you cannot have what you want. You quarrel and fight. You do not have, because you do not ask God. When you ask, you do not receive because you ask with the wrong motives, that you may spend what you get on your pleasures. You adulterous people, don't you know that friendship with the world is hatred toward God. James 4:1-3

Our battle is in our thinking! Everything we think must pass a **heart test, because as a man thinks in his heart so is he.** Dr. Amen, the brain specialist, says we have so many **Automatic Negative Thoughts** – **ANTs.** Whenever one of these negative, devious, self-serving thoughts enters our mind, cast it down. Don't believe it. Speak to it and to yourself and refuse to entertain that thought. Call it out as a negative thought and do not act on it. Seek the truth. There is always safety in the truth. In a world that has accepted manipulation and lies as a way of doing business, we need to teach our children that there is a higher standard! His name is Jesus, the truth, the way and the life.


