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Tower of Babel Part 2: The Female Goddess

In our last letter, we examined the lie, “to seduce if it were possible, even the elect” (Mark 13:22) as climate change, that great delusion that would come upon the whole world at the end of times, the modern Tower of Babel. Now let us examine another ‘great delusion’: the female goddess.

In earlier times, women were circumspect, modest, chaste till marriage (at least in most churches). But as a whole, women and motherhood were sacred; people who were special and cherished. Then along came the female freedom movement, Feminism. The movement's great lie is that our morality and men actually oppressing to women; that women were in bondage or slavery to these ideals; that she is sacrificing her time, her beauty, her body, to marry and have children when she could indeed become a modern “*Astarte*”, the sex goddess of the bible. This ‘freedom’ of women has entered into much of the church. Just like Israel of old, which fell to whoredom, so are we. *Do not prostitute your daughter, to cause her to be a harlot, lest the land fall into harlotry, and the land become full of wickedness. Lev. 19:29 Moreover thou hast taken thy sons and thy daughters, whom thou hast borne unto me, and these hast thou sacrificed unto them to be devoured. Is this of thy whoredoms a small matter, That thou hast slain my children, and delivered them to cause them to pass through the fire for them? Ezek 16:20-21 And it came to pass through the lightness of her whoredom, that she defiled the land, and committed adultery with stones and with stocks. Jer 3:9*

Porn use by women is urged in colleges and sex education classes for children, as well as many other types of abominations. Yet, Jesus is coming again in person, not to the earth but first in the clouds. Only the repentant will arise to meet Him in the air so to ever be with the Lord. Pray that the elect will stand in the day of great delusions and teach their children to stand against them too.

Two weeks ago, a young man came into the office for a visit. He met with the staff and told his story, his first stop since getting out!. He had been in prison and had enrolled in our bible study. After 2 lessons, he was released. They prayed with him and give him a bible story book for his children. About 10 days later he returned to visit with Eileen. I encouraged him to write his story, when in fact he came in with it already written and allowed me to publish it here.

Hello, my name is Ryan Scott. I'm 36 and this is my testimony. I have to confess that I am truly guilty. I had everything a man could ever want in life. A good wife, 5 good kids, house, cars, and the best family anyone could ever ask for. But I bet you want to know what went wrong. The immediate cause was heavy combination of drugs. But as time has gone by, I'd have to say that it was just my true self coming to the surface. For the past 13 years, I hid my frustration, fears, hatred and anger deep down inside. I wasn't ready to admit to others that I didn't really have it together. I was lost, had been from the beginning and had never asked anyone for directions. To top it all off, I was enslaved to sin. It was my master, Satan holding my chains. He had me dancing to his tune and I didn't even know it. How blind could I be?

So I destroyed the one thing that I really felt was mine. The one that I loved was destroyed by my own selfishness by my own hands. Hopeless, guilt-ridden, bringing shame to my family and facing perhaps years in prison, I sat in my cell and wondered how it all had happened and where it would end. I tried to end it myself but couldn't quite do it.

I thank God now that I couldn't. Then God brought this man to me who told me of this man named Jesus. A little while later, God gave me another man as a cell mate and they both told me that Jesus was not just a man. Jesus was God. They said Jesus had come to seek and to save that which was lost, and that He came to give His life as a ransom for us all. I was always opposed to the Bible. I thought I knew all about the Bible because of who my family is. The fact was that I had never actually read it for myself. But through these two men that God has given me, they have told me of the love that only God could have for me. How He had sent His only Son Jesus Christ to go through life just as we do; just so He could die for the world and for me personally.

I didn't want to believe it because of the way things were. But once I believed, once I put my trust and life in what He said and had already done for me, I simply confessed all of my sins to God and thanked Jesus Christ for dying and God raised Him so I would be forgiven. From this point forward I will live my life for God and praise Jesus Christ, my Lord, first and never let Satan bind me in chains ever again. Jesus Christ is my savior and because of Him I have been set free.



Ryan and I talked for a hour or two and he told me how he came to Little Lambs. It seems that good friend with the good news, his cellmate, was a Little Lamb. He had finished our course and suggested that Ryan learn more about God through our bible studies. Ryan is from Sebring. Ryan did enroll and came in to get his next lesson and tell us his story. It does my heart good to see that our Lambs are out there doing the work of the ministry and leading others to freedom. Praise the Lord. And that little Bible Story Book, his children call him every night and his son reads to him from it. Amen!

My name is Darrell. I am currently incarcerated in Arkansas. I was informed that you all have a really good Bible Study Course and if it is not too much to ask I would like to participate in your course. I am currently in the PALS program: Pals stands for Principals-Application-Life-Skills. From 6 am to 10 am, we participate and have mentors from the outside come to us and speak and preach the Word of God. It is a great program to be in. I enjoy the study and I enjoy studying the Word of God. I just wanted to share a little about myself and what I do while I am incarcerated to better myself as a person. Hi, I just figured I would take a little time to write and tell you thank you and that I'm excited about this new venture. So far, I like the design of learning you have with your courses. I just finished the first one, took me about a week. I think the best way to learn something you read, is to write it down after you read it and the more you do it the more you'll remember it.

And I like how we are studying out of the King James Version, so that nothing is watered down!:)

I read your story and I can relate because I am an alcoholic/drug addict who has experienced enough "rock bottoms" you could write hundreds of books about. And even though I got saved my first time going to prison over 20 years ago and even had a relationship with God, went to church, was involved in Recovery like A.A. and Celebrate Recovery up till my latest arrest, there was something I still had not surrendered to God. Something He's been telling me my whole life, but my fear (lack of faith is what it really boils down to) has kept me in my sin and allowed it to direct my life. God doesn't just want a part or parts of me. He wants all of me and to completely trust in ALL His ways and live my life according to His will, decrees, statutes and commands. He told me this time I got arrested, "Yea, yea David, I know you've been trying...TRY HARDER!!!" And I don't mean that in the sense of trying to earn my way to salvation through my good works. I mean, He wants me to try to let His Spirit that lives inside me take over. (For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God." Rom 8:14) I try to listen and obey the stirrings of the Spirit inside me. Lately I have and lately I have a lot more hope for my life. I have less fear, stress, worry, doubt and there is a peace in my heart. Lately, I cannot get enough of God's Word. I'm participating in a couple handfuls of bible studies and I'm blessed to start this one with your ministry because I asked for something more challenging. I know God's got a huge calling on my life to tell others about Christ and right now I feel He's chastened me this time so I can finally listen to "His still small whisper" of what His plan for me was all along. I'm serving a 10 year sentence in a Texas Prison for DWI and intoxicated assault. This time I wasn't the only victim in my wreck. I have a year and a half served on my sentence, but have already been denied my first parole. I'm doing my best this time by taking what the enemy meant for evil and letting God turn it for good. I've already decided and committed to dedicating another year of my freedom after I'm released to a Christian Discipleship Program in my county. As long as I'm in Christ, I'm always free. Please pray that I'm finally able to be delivered from the hardest, longest battle of my life, the battle of alcoholism and drug addiction. Thank you for your service to Christ and I can't wait for the next lesson!!! In God we trust, David

My introduction to the Little Lambs Ministry came almost 40 years ago. John Sala would often bring a couple inmates from Avon Park Correctional Institution down to our church in Lake Placid for an evening service of singing, testimonies and all the cake and ice cream the men could eat. These special occasions were always a hit with our congregation.

Over the years, I have stayed in touch with my friends at Little Lambs. Now retired, I have recently volunteered to help process its nationwide Bible correspondence course. It's safe to say that thousands of students in prisons and jails across the country have been served. The completion of the entire course usually takes 12-18 months, at which time the student receives an embossed certificate and a beautiful new King James study Bible.

At my orientation, Eileen Sala explained that one of my jobs would be to grade the Bible lessons. I casually suggested that I should probably complete Lesson 1 myself "to get a feel" for the task facing the student.

Boy, was I surprised! Lesson 1 was 16 pages, a veritable "sword drill" to learn both the layout and structure of the Bible itself, as well as a taste of many fundamental Scriptures from the creation story to the sounding of the seventh trumpet. It was tough! Over several days, I logged 7-8 hours digging, collating and copying. And I'm told that the lessons- all done in the King James Bible, which I like - gradually get tougher and longer.

Can't wait for Lesson 2.
