Little Lambs Ministry. First of all I want to sincerely thank you for making this and future studies available to me. I enjoy them so much and I really look forward to ones in the future. I want to learn as much about Jesus as I can. I am a very low bottom addict. I have been drinking and using for 20 years. I was 3 1/2 years sober at one point through a drug court program. From sobriety, I met a good girl, started a family and saved \$50,000 to put on my first house. I kept getting promoted at work and my life got better than I ever thought it could. Then I relapsed and my relapse was with crack cocaine. It took over my life. I lost everything: my jobs, my house, and my family. I am now on my way to prison for a bunch of theft charges. But I have given my life to Christ and I know His word is true and I can rely on His promises of restoration, healing, and hope if I live in surrender to Him. My children are 3 and 5 years old. Please pray for them. I am in a constant battle flopping between faith and trust and to then worry, fear and anxiety. I feel terrible for my children. DL

When I first started the class I didn't like it. I thought I didn't need any help and I thought I knew it all. But the more and more I listened and paid attention, I noticed I had a lot of those character flaws and I made a lot of those thinking errors. I felt so stupid because I was doing a bunch of things to run away from the truth and responsibility and if it weren't for your class I'd still be in the dark about things that might cost me my relationship with my live ones and friends. I feel like a new man and can't wait to apply my new knowledge that I learned into my life. Thanks for your help and guidance cause I want to be respected and loved and appreciated and I don't want to die alone miserable. LG

What I learned in this class since attending is that I was a codependent for my wife and I didn't even realize it and that I really didn't have any personal boundaries. I was my wife's stepping stones, her life raft, her protector and etc. any time she would get arrested, I would be there in a heartbeat to bail her out. When someone in the family would put her down or accuse her of something, I would always defend her even when I knew she was wrong. My wife would threaten me with leaving if I didn't get her drugs and I knew she cheated on me for many years. Yet I stayed. Well, after taking this class I can honestly say I have learned how to set boundaries and not to be so codependent and I have learned how to say NO! This class has taught me first how to be a better person for me before I can be a better person for anyone else and it has showed me how to make my family a functional family. I know that God is there for me and my family. And I can turn to Him at all times, good and bad. My desire is to lead my family to God and to let them know that He is a loving, understanding and forgiving God. I don't know if there are enough words to express my sincere thanks and gratitude for your time, wisdom, knowledge and experience and of course your patience. So now I say thank you Mrs. Sala for giving so freely to me and the class and for sending mot of these gates a brand new man and father. Thank you and God bless you. DL

You really got me with some of the reasons I am the way I am and I hope after I take this class again I take it more seriously. We had a failed air conditioner, sewer problems, failed hot water heater, ceiling problems, faulty wiring going on and off, serious staff health problems, were notified that they will not reprint our graduation bible until March (which means we will have to purchase on the open market online without our huge discount until then), my own leaky roof at home, storm damage there. It seemed like every day presented a new opportunity to be tested! I thank God for the volunteers in the office whose spirit couldn't be quenched by any of these things. They just continue to soldier on with the tasks at hand. The problems are just giants in the land that we must conquer. What did we learn?

My good news is after my last visit to my doctor for my spinal surgery, all my restrictions were lifted and it is so great to be normal again and not have to be guarded with every move. And my leg is pain free! Thank you to everyone who prayed for me. Now, if you would, continue to pray for Mary Tinberg, who is having a serious health challenge. Mary is in the office 4 days a week and accompanies me for outside ministry. She is an important part of our ministry and we love her dearly.

He said that and the little cards helped him so much and he wanted the same for his residents. Evidently he works with other programs and suggested he get them involved too. It is so encouraging to see one of our lambs prospering so much in the gospel and leading others to Christ. We have sent him a copy of the lessons and instructions for enrolling his residents. Our mission is to minister to not only prisoners, but former prisoners and residents in recovery programs, even the spouse of resident or inmate.

Looking back, I can see so many reasons for being thankful this Thanksgiving holiday, beginning with my salvation 44 years ago. God has blessed the ministry of Little Lambs through the last 27 years with all our volunteers and partners. No crisis has not been met and solved. We continue to see fruit as our students and graduates become fruitful in their own right. A lady sat beside me in church Sunday to tell me that years ago she came to see me with an addicted son. She said she could not do what I recommended at that time. It was too drastic for a mother to do. However, as the years went by she was forced to do it and it saved her sons life. He is now sober and with a precious family. She wanted to say 'thank you' and let me know how she appreciated what we do. Again I am so blessed and thankful that the Lord allows us the freedom to minister in this way. We never know when such a blessing comes through our doors. We pray for all of you our partners, a blessed and very special Thanksgiving.
